A top-notch team of Ocoee 13-year-olds will be playing in the Tampa area this Saturday at 11 a.m. in the Sectional Junior All-Star Tournament as District 14's champion and representative.

The Ocoee Junior stars won the area tournament in three games that each necessitated applying the five-inning slaughter rule. Aaron Speer pitched a two-hit 11-0 shutout over Winter Garden, and Scott McCoy (who was 3-0 on the mound in tournament play) had six strike outs in Ocoee's 17-3 defeat of Windermere.

In the area finals Ocoee outscored Windermere (who had gone undefeated in the losers' bracket) by 14-3. Brandon Brooks was the winning pitcher with four strike outs in this game.

The Ocoee Juniors then advanced to the District 14 tourney and opened up with a 16-3 defeat of Oviedo. McCoy was the winning pitcher.

But Oviedo (with a strong performance by pitcher Jay Holmes) came back to edge Ocoee 6-5, followed by a 5-0 Ocoee championship win over Oviedo. McCoy was once again the winning pitcher on a one-hit shutout.

The Ocoee All-Stars posted a .333 team batting average and a .531 on-base percentage in these six games and showed their aggressiveness by stealing an average of 12 bases per game. They averaged more than 11 runs per game and allowed less than three runs per game.

Catcher Justin McWilliams only gave up three stolen bases in the entire tourney.


McCoy had 20 strike outs in his three mound victories and gave up a total of nine hits.

Shortstop Brian Gilbert not only played outstanding defense, said Manager Gary Hood, he led the team with a .533 batting average. McWilliams also posted an impressive .500 average at the plate.

"All the players played good defense and hit the ball well," said Hood.

He praised the entire team for this winning effort and characterized them as a group of players who work hard, have readily given up their summer vacations, are easy to coach and have great attitudes.

"They all act just like brothers," he said. "They help each other do well."

Local Big Leaguers win 2nd state title

Things were not looking good for the District 14 Big League All-Stars Monday night at Del Ray Beach.

With two outs in the top of the seventh inning of the final game for the state championship, the Ocoee and Winter Garden team was down two runs, trailing Dunedin of District 12 by a score of 5-3.

But things changed before the third out.

"With a big rally and key hits from Jeremy Trowell, Scott McCoy and Aaron Speer, we scored seven runs in the top of the seventh, and Justin Holmes closed the game out on the mound to win the ball game," said Gary Hood, manager of the District 14 All-Stars.

With this 10-5 victory, the locals

also won the state title for the second year in a row and are headed to the Southern Regional Tournament in Easley, S.C., this Saturday.

According to Hood, the Dunedin pitcher lost control and walked a couple of batters in the seventh, and the combined key hits by the District 14 batters iced the win.

"We thought the game was over earlier in the inning, but the umpire called catcher interference and that kept us alive in the seventh," said Hood Tuesday morning.

This team won the Sectional 3 Tournament early last week in Mango by defeating the District 13 All-Stars from Bloomingdale 5-3.

At sectionals, Justin McWilliams was 3 for 3 at the plate, and Jon Roberts was 1 for 2 with two runs batted in. Ross Daniels hit a home run to provide offensive power.

Mike Gilley teamed with J.R. Schuhman and Speer on the mound to shut down District 13.

"Mike did a great job," said Hood. "He kept the ball down in the strike zone and got a lot of ground balls to the infield. J.R. came in the fifth inning and did a real good job keeping the District 13 batters off balance."

Speer came in to relieve Schuhman to close the game out.

"With bases loaded, Aaron made a great play with a line drive back at home from a Bloomingdale hitter and then turned around and got a force out at second base to end the game," said Hood. "That was a pretty tense moment."

This year's District 14 All-Stars are a young team with nine new

players and only six returners off the World Championship team of last season.

"But this team stepped up and got the job done to advance to the State Tournament," said Hood.

In the first game of a double-header to open the State Tournament in Del Ray Beach, District 14 defeated District 12 16-11. Mike Gurney, Schuhman and Gilley got the job done on the mound, and leading hitters were McWilliams (4 for 4 with a home run), Daniels (3 for 3), Roberts (3 for 5) and Trowell (3 for 5).


In the second game, the locals defeated District 7 from Palm Beach Gardens 6-2. Devin Anderson, pitching a complete game, had six strikeouts.

Providing offensive power were Speer (2 for 3 with two homers and three runs batted in), McWilliams (2 for 3 with a homer) and Roberts (1 for 2 with a home run).

District 12 of Dunedin advanced out of the losers' bracket to defeat District 14 9-6. Roberts went 2 for 3 with a home run, McWilliams was 1 for 2, and Speer added a homer in the losing effort.

Hood expressed pride in this group of young players from Ocoee and Winter Garden and announced that a special meeting is being held at the Ocoee Little League Board Room this Thursday, July 27, at 7 p.m.

"Donations are needed to help get these young men to Easley, S.C., for the Southern Regional," said Hood. "Our first game is Saturday starting with a double-header."



Old rivals join together at World Series

Apopka and West Orange sport one of Central Florida's most heated rivalries in high school baseball. But this summer, players from both schools have teamed up in pursuit of a larger goal — a national championship.

Representing Florida's District 14, and now the entire South, an Ocoee-based team of 17- and 18-year-olds opens play today at the Big League World Series in Tucson, Ariz.

Five American squads — East, South, Central, West and host Tucson — battle for a berth in the finals against Canada, Lithuania, Saipan or Puerto Rico. Saturday's championship game will be televised on ESPN2.

"I think we've got a good shot," said senior West Orange pitcher Mike Gurney. "It's going to be nice to be there and have the honor to go. Hopefully we'll be hyped up enough to go out there and win it all."

The road to Tucson has been filled with dramatic comebacks and lopsided victories in three qualifying

tournaments.

District 14 actually lost its first postseason game to Tampa, then fought its way out of the losers' bracket for a crosstown matchup against District 3 — a collection of players from Winter Park, Colonial and Boone.

Back-to-back wins against District 3 propelled District 14 to the state tournament, where it beat Jacksonville

Arlington, 14-5, in the finals.

At the South Regionals last weekend in Easley, S.C., District 14 pounded out wins of 12-1 over Texas and 22-4 over South Carolina. Louisiana notched a 7-6 victory before District 14 got revenge, winning 19-3 and 20-7 in a doubleheader to claw its way out of the losers' bracket and advance to the World Series.

"These kids are unbelievable," said Coach Gary Hood, who also manages Ocoee Little League. "Every one of them is very well-behaved and cultured. These kids just love to play ball."

Hood said every player on the 15-man roster has been hot at the plate. Pitchers Tim Gray (4-0), Aaron Spears (2-0), Michael Cunningham (2-0) and Josh Muse (3-0) have been virtually untouchable.

Justin McWilliams and Gabe Powell hit grand slams in the wins against Louisiana and were named co-MVPs in the regional final. Cunningham, Michael Spears and Mike Reese each had four-hit games in the regional tournament.

First-baseball Mark Folsom contributed a 460-foot home run in a 3-2 win over Arlington during the state tournament before leaving to join a scout team.

Now, a handful of games separate District 14 from the ultimate goal — Big League World Series champions.

"I think we should fare pretty good," Coach Zack Prettyman said. "We've scrapped along this far. We won't give up and lay down. We'll definitely give it our best shot."

A highlight of the ceremonies will be a presentation of a Special Achievement Award to Scott McCoy, Aaron Speer and Justin McWilliams for their accomplishments over the years with the Ocoee Little League.

Scott, the son of Russ and Diane McCoy of Ocoee, has been involved with the league for the past 14 years. He is currently attending and playing baseball for Seminole Community College.

Aaron, the son of Greg and Jill Speer of Ocoee, has spent the past 10 years in the Ocoee Little League. He is currently attending Valencia Community College and will be attending

and playing baseball with Santa Fe Community College in Gainesville next season.

Justin, the son of Mark and Jamie McWilliams of Ocoee, plans to enroll in college this fall and pursue his baseball career at that time.

According to their former coach, Gary Hood: "Over the past six years these young men have accomplished something that may never happen again in Ocoee Little League history. They were involved with teams that have won 13 pennants and two runner-up titles."

In 1995 in the Junior Division, they were involved in winning the District 14 All-Star Championship and finishing as runners-up in the Section 3 Tournament.

Other achievements: in 1996, winning the District 14 Senior Top Team Championship and being runners-up in the District 14 All-Star Tournament; in 1997, winning the District 14 All-Star Senior Top Team Championship for the second straight year, the District 14 All-Star Championship, the Sectional 3 Championship and finishing fourth in the State

Senior League Tournament.

In 1999, as members of the District 14 Big League All-Stars, they won the Section 3 title, the Big League State Championship, the Southern Regional Championship and the Big League World Series.

McWilliams was not involved with the Senior Top Team championships but was involved with winning the District 14 Major Top Team championship in 1994 with the Ocoee Little League.

Hood said these players worked hard and showed a great deal of dedication over the years.

"These young men have been a joy to manage, and they know that their accomplishments could not have happened without help from their teammates, coaches and, most of all, their parents for working with them over the years from T-ball to Big League," said Hood.

Opening Day games will begin following the ceremonies and will continue at the Little League Complex and at Sorenson Field all day, ending with 7 p.m. games.

The District 14 Big League All-Stars began their effort to defend their world title by winning their opening games in the Sectional 3 Tournament held this past weekend in Mango.

The players, 13 from Ocoee and two from Winter Garden, were set to meet the losers' bracket winners on Tuesday night of this week (after presstime). The winner will advance to the State Tournament in Delray Beach this weekend.

In their first game, the District 14 All-Stars defeated District 6 from Tampa by a score of 3-0. Mike Gurney pitched a complete game, only giving up two hits and striking out eight batters.

Scott McCoy, who was 2 for 3 at the plate, and Steve Lenzi, who went 2 for 4 with a two-run home run, provided the offensive power.

Ross Daniel also went 2-4 and provided outstanding defensive

play as well.

In Game 2, District 14 defeated a very good District 13 team from Bloomingdale 6-3. Devin Anderson, in pitching a complete game, struck out six batters.

Leading hitters were Justin McWilliams, who was 3-4 with a home run, and Jon Roberts, who went 2-4 and banged a two-run homer.

"That's the best that I have seen Mike pitch all this year," said Gary Hood, manager of the District 14 All-Stars, of the opening game.
